Key Vocabulary	
Habitat	A place where animals/plants/humans usually live.
Arctic	The very cold area around the North Pole.
Antarctica	The very cold area around the South Pole.
Weather	The daily state of the atmosphere, or air, in place.
Climate	The average of weather conditions in an area over a long period.
Mammals	A warm-blooded animal with a backbone that feeds its young with milk produced by the mother and has skin usually more or less covered with hair.
Pinnipeds	A mammal with front and back limbs that look like fins. Pinnipeds have a round head and a round body that gets thinner towards the end.
Migrate	To pass from one region to another on a regular basis. Many birds migrate south for the winter.
Continent	A continent is a massive area of land that is separated from others by water or other natural features. There are seven continents .
Ocean	An ocean is a huge body of salt water.
Equator	An equator is an imaginary line around the middle of a planet (Earth). It is halfway between the North Pole and the South Pole

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -The Arctic Fox has the warmest fur, even warmer than a polar bear and arctic wolf. - Arctic Fox can be either grey, blue or white. - The Arctic Fox eats small mammals and sea birds. - Arctic Foxes walk along the snow, listening for small creatures 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Polar Bears only live in the Northern Arctic. - They are the largest land meat eater in the world and the largest of the bear family. - Polar Bear's skin is actually black which helps them to soak up heat from the sun to keep warm. - They are great swimmers! 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Most penguins live in the Southern Hemisphere - No penguins live at the North Pole. -Penguins can drink sea water. -Penguins spend around half their time in water and the other half on land. -Penguins in Antarctica have no land based predators.
