Key Vocabulary

Reptiles	A type of animal such as snakes and lizards, They have dry scaly skin and lay soft-shelled eggs on land
Mammals	Is warm blooded and has hair or fur
Herbivores	An animal that eats plants
Carnivores	An animal that eats other animals
Omnivores	An animal that eats plants and other animals
Skeleton	Bone and cartilage which supports the body
Environment	The conditions where a person, animal or plant lives
Habitat	The natural home of a plant or animal
Senses	See, hear, smell, taste and touch
