

# Shadsworth Infant School PE and Sport Premium Strategy statement and impact 2023/2024



Shadsworth Infant school is dedicated to raising standards of PE across the school. All pupils are involved in an enriched physical exercise program during curriculum time, which includes a variety of activities designed to challenge and inspire the children. As well as these curriculum activities, Shadsworth Infant School provides every child with the opportunity to take part in enrichment clubs after school, which again cover a wide range of sports. In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for physical education (PE) and sport. This funding is to be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of. Shadsworth Infant school has decided to use the funding in the following ways:
