
Message from Mrs Crompton

What is asthma?

Asthma is a long term health condition that affects the airways

It affects 1/12 adults and 1/11 children-that is 2-3 children in each class.

For those affected when they come into contact with a trigger, the muscles around their airways become tight and the lining becomes swollen and inflamed narrowing the air passage (imagine diameter of a hose pipe reducing to a straw)

The development of mucus or phlegm further reduces the airway and the persons ability to move air in and out of the lungs, for further information - please use the below QR code to download the app.

Let's look at this week's story

Think about: Do you think a prime minister should be able to receive gifts? Why do you think people give gifts to a prime minister?
