The price of stamps went up by 30p in October.

Think about: What are stamps? Why do people buy stamps?

Explain that people buy stamps to stick onto the letters, cards or parcels they want to send through the post. Stamps show postal workers that the person who is sending the letter, card or parcel has paid for it to be delivered. At this time of year, many people send cards to each other. It is thought that with the cost of stamps going up, not as many cards will be sent through the post this year.

Think about: Have you been writing and giving any cards out recently? Do you enjoy receiving cards? What do you like about it? Opening the envelope, looking at any pictures on the card, reading the message inside? Do you send your cards through the post? How else can you get a card to someone?



Rule of Law

There are rules we must follow when we send a letter or a parcel through the post. These include adding an address to show where the letter or parcel is going, and stamps to show we have paid for the letter or parcel to be delivered.

Protected The Characteristics

Some people send cards to celebrate events as part of their religion or belief. Nobody should be treated unfairly because of their religion or belief.
