RECEPTION



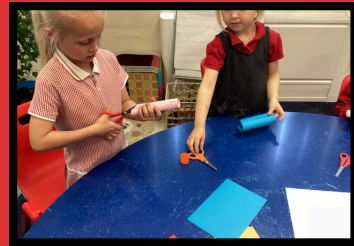
