



Key Vocabulary	
Fossil	A fossil is the preserved remains or impressions of a living organism such as a plant, animal, or insect.
Herbivore	Herbivores are animals that only eat plants. They are herbivorous animals.
Carnivore	A carnivore is an animal which eats only meat. Predators commonly hunt and kill their own prey.
Omnivore	An omnivore is an animal that feeds on plants and other animals.
Extinct	When an entire species, or type, of animal dies out, that species is extinct. Once a species becomes extinct, it is gone forever.
Reptile	Reptiles are a group of cold-blooded animals which have skins covered with small hard plates called scales and lay eggs. Snakes, lizards, and crocodiles are reptiles

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -The Tyrannosaurus Rex roamed the planet during the late Cretaceous Period 65 million years ago. -The T. Rex was super smart, with a brain twice as big as other giant carnivores. -The terrific T. Rex was a seriously big beast, growing up to 12m long and 6m tall! 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Brachiosaurus lived in North America during the Late Jurassic Period. -The length of Brachiosaurus is believed to have been around 26 metres. -The Brachiosaurus was a herbivore, that feed on foliage high above the ground. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Stegosaurus had brains the size of ping pong balls. -Their length was up to 9 meters and 4 metres tall. -The Stegosaurus was a dinosaur that lived about 150 million years ago during the Late Jurassic Period. Fossils of the Stegosaurus have been found in western North America and Europe.
