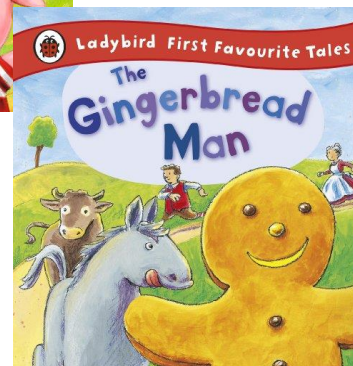
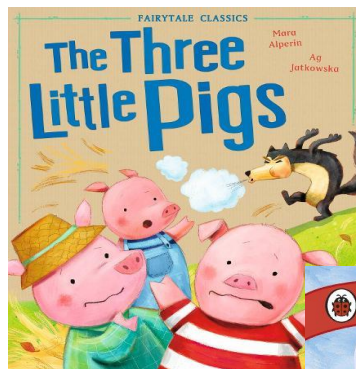


Reception Knowledge Organiser Traditional Tales

Key Vocabulary

Traditional Tale	A story that has been told and repeated for many years
Character	A person in a story, play or film
Villain	An evil character
Setting	The place or type of type of surrounding that a story is set in
Retell	To tell a story again that you know in your own words
Ingredients	The important items needed to cook/bake something
Christmas	A Christian festival celebrating the birth of Jesus
Christmas Story	The story telling about the birth of God's son Jesus.



Popular Traditional Tales



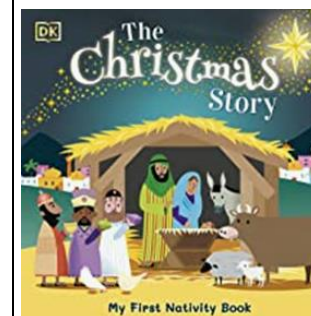
Key Learning

- To recognise some common Traditional Tales

- To be able to sequence and retell a Traditional Tale
- To follow simple instructions in sequence, working towards a desired outcome

Characteristics of Effective Learning

 - Acting out experiences with other people
