



David Frederick Attenborough is born in Isleworth, West London. He has two brothers and his parents later foster two sisters during the Second World War.	Two years after receiving a scholarship, David graduates from Cambridge University with a masters in natural science. He then completes two years in the Royal Navy.	David marries Jane Grief and the pair later have two children together. His first job is as an editor of children's science textbooks.	David presents 'Zoo Quest', his first major natural history presenting role. The television series allows viewers to see exotic animals in their natural habitat.	David becomes the network controller of BBC Two. He oversees the first colour television broadcast in Europe.	He begins writing and narrating the 'Life on Earth' series; 13 initial episodes that explore wildlife and the evolution of nature around the world. Many more series follow.	He is knighted for his services to television broadcasting and programming and becomes 'Sir David Attenborough'.	Sir David narrates 'Planet Earth' - the most expensive nature documentary series the BBC has ever made.	He is a key speaker at the COP26 climate change conference. Sir David also becomes the only person to be knighted twice.
