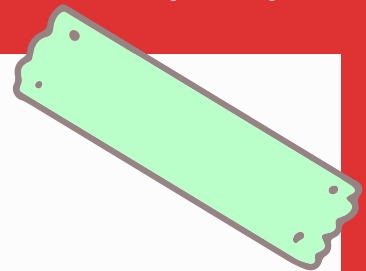

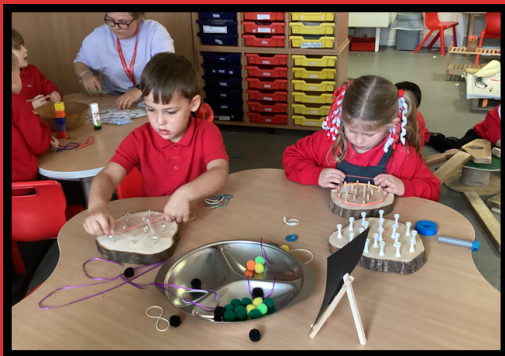
MURPHY

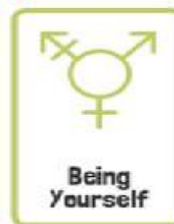
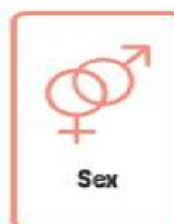
